Proceedings of the Adjoined Meeting of the Academic Council held on 26/8/2004. (1)
ITEM NO.3: To review the regulation No. III "Course of Study" of BA/B.Sc Semester Scheme 2004 pertaining to languages under part-I.

The matter was discussed at length and the following members took part in the discussion. Dr. Siddalingaiah, Dr. Hanumantharayappa, Sri. Vasudeva Murthy, Prof. Kundagol and Prof. K. S. Murthy.

It was unanimously resolved to review the Regulation No. III, retaining the original Annual Scheme Regulation for languages under Part-I. The Vice-Chancellor read out the Notification No. Aca /RI/ADDNL ENGLISH/2000-2001, dt. 5.10.2000 and it was resolved to incorporate it along with the following conditions mentioned therein.

"2 languages allowed by the University out of which atleast one shall be an Indian Language subject to the proviso that a candidate for the BA/B.Sc/B.Com degree shall offer atleast one of the Languages he/she studied for the PUC Examination. However, in case of Foreign Nationals who have not studied an Indian Language, the Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to permit them to study any two languages or English or Additional English. However under Part-I, language II shall be Business Communication (Commercial Correspondence) for the students of II-year B.Com course."

The following category of candidates are permitted to opt Additional English in lieu of Indian Languages at BA/B.Sc/B.Com/BBM/BHM/B.Sc(FAD) courses:

- i) Candidates who have passed 10+2 Examination from CBSE/ISCE and who have not studied any Indian Language at the qualifying Examination. (2)
- ii) Candidates who have passed the qualifying Examination from North Eastern States like West Bengal, Assam, Meghalaya, Nagaland, etc., and who have studied the subjects like Bengali, Assamese, etc., at their qualifying Examination.
- iii) Candidates who have studied 'FRENCH' at the qualifying Examination, and
- iv) Candidate who wants to change the Language to Additional English giving the valid reason that the Colleges are not offering the languages which they have studied at the qualifying Examination.

Further, there was discussion about adopting a single text book or otherwise for the different languages at UG level. Dr. K.N. Pushpalatha, Dr. Siddalingaiah, Prof. K.S. Murthy and Prof. K.M. Hanumantharayappa took part in the discussion. The Vice-Chancellor finally clarified that the matter may be referred to the respective Board of Studies to resolve taking both work load and requirement of languages for particular courses such as B.Com., LL.B., etc.
